

Section 1:**➤ Funds**

Funds, in this case, may be granted to individuals that are experiencing the disastrous event of having a terminally ill child that are legally and verifiably sponsored by an NATF supported 501 (c) (3) Children's Medical Research or Treatment Facility or other Medical Organization.

In many cases the quality of life that they have worked so hard at providing for their families suffers from the loss of income due to time spent coordinating the recovery and treatment of the sponsored ill child.

Loss of income can result from the loss of time spent away from, or the loss of, their employment that can result in the loss of their homes, autos, funds for food and clothing, utilities and other necessities. Individuals that can show evidence of this sponsorship and resulting loss can request or be offered a grant equal to their annual combined salaries or other lost compensation, which may or may not be considered retroactive in nature, on an ongoing basis for the duration of the sponsorship.

The Grant Fund is subject to immediate revocation and legal investigation or action if fraud is evident or suspected, although no repayment of granted funds will be sought or demanded with the exception of proven criminal fraud cases.

Grants to other individuals not described above may include grants for homes, vehicles, food and clothing, rent or mortgages, utilities or other necessities if proof of need can be established, and the need is deemed a detriment in progress.

Grants may also be sought or offered for educational assistance purposes or for small business start-ups and other community development or re-development programs or initiatives or for any economic development programs such as Historic Preservation Activities, Programs and Projects or any related programs to include Battlefield Identification, Preservation and Protection Programs in accordance to and in compliance with 16 USC 469K-1 of the American Battlefield Protection Program, and Cultural Property Crime Prevention Activities, Programs and related efforts.
